Mutual Housing was featured in a *Woodland Daily Democrat* article when the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced that a group will receive \$3 million of \$26 million slated to help provide safe and sanitary housing for farmworkers in nine affordable rental communities in four states – California, Florida, Kansas and Texas. The money locally will go toward building 39 affordable apartments in the Spring Lake area of Woodland, where energy-efficient housing has already been built.

In 2010, Mutual Housing acquired the 5.14 acres on which the townhomes are built. It broke ground on 3.28 acres in December 2013. The remaining acres will be developed when the nonprofit receives funding, which could occur now that the \$3 million grant has been approved.

Founded in 1988, Mutual Housing California develops, operates and advocates for sustainable rental housing for the diversity of the region's households. Earlier this year, Mutual Housing at Spring Lake received the first LEED platinum certified home for multi-family affordable housing in Woodland. It features photovoltaic solar panels on apartments and car ports, and in 2015 became the Department of Energy's first nationally certified zero net energy multifamily rental community in the U.S.
